

Pallative Care Project: Complete

e are so pleased to announce the completion of the Jeremy Snook Memorial Palliative Suites. The Palliative Suites are one of eight projects funded through the \$16M Gratitude Campaign. We wish to thank all our Gratitude Campaign donors for the significant impact you have made on healthcare in our region and want to remind you of the difference you are making, every single day.

By now, we hope you have seen the beautiful photos and videos of the three large Palliative Suites. Each suite features a patient room, a family room (with kitchenette and a convertible couch/bed for overnight stays), and a shared bathroom. In addition, a secure family lounge has been created to allow a quiet refuge. Each suite is generous, with room for family and friends to gather, for end of life ceremonies, for consultation with medical staff, and space for quiet contemplation and grieving.

These suites are designed to provide patients and their families with a serene and comforting space. It is also a space designed to meet the needs of the healthcare professionals, where they can provide the best possible specialized end of life compassionate care for their patients.

The ward of suites has been named the Jeremy Snook Memorial Palliative Suites in honour of the beloved son of Brian and Gail Snook who passed away in 2014. Brian and Gail were instrumental in creating and running the Jeremy Snook Memorial Raffle and attracting multiple donations and attention to the palliative suites project. The three individual suites are named for the lead donors to the palliative suites project – the Imperial Oil Suite to acknowledge a major gift from Imperial Oil and the Imperial Oil Foundation, the RE/MAX Fort McMurray Suite to acknowledge the tremendous efforts and funds received from Lance Bussieres and his family of agents, and the Fouts Family Suite to acknowledge the campaign leadership and senior level funding from Dan & Janet Fouts.

This project could not have been started or completed without the generosity of our donors. Unfortunately, we are not able to gather at this time to celebrate the completion of the Jeremy Snook Memorial Palliative Suites, but please know that the suites will soon be available to provide end of life care in our region. Over the past months, the Health Foundation and the hospital have received numerous offers of support and acts of kindness from all areas of the community. Frontline workers received handmade scrub bags, mask holders, and other comfort items.

These gifts are distributed to the pediatrics, Diagnostic Imaging, Allied Health and Emergency

departments and certainly make a child's visit to the hospital easier.

The SunCares Changemakers program recognizes and celebrates Suncor employees who go above and beyond in their communities and annually identifies five employees as SunCares Changemakers. Each Changemaker identifies a community organization(s) of their choice. Criteria for selection is based on a number of factors including volunteer efforts, creation of community initiatives or programs, making a significant impact in community and personal donations. In addition to recognition, the Suncor Energy Foundation made a donation of \$6,500 to the Health Foundation to honour Naseem's great community work.

Your Previous Contributions at Work During the Pandemic

here does my donation money go and how does it make a difference? We receive these two questions frequently and are always able to demonstrate the importance of your funding. Funds raised at events, through 3rd party fundraising, by working casinos, and donations to our Greatest Needs fund are pooled to maximize the projects we can support to AHS in our region. We also receive grants and donations from industry partners allocated to major projects. As we celebrate the Health Foundation's 35th anniversary we look back on the impact of over \$75M invested in healthcare locally. We can't be together during this pandemic so we thought we would revisit some of our previous funding announcements and show you the impact your support is having that allows the Northern Lights Health Centre to continue to treat patients with care and compassion.

MATERNAL CARE

Donors to the Health Foundation funded the expansion of the Maternal Care ward of the Northern Lights Health Centre including adding more patient rooms, creating the family waiting room, the expansion of the Non-Stress Test (NST) Clinic, and the creation of the Special Care Nursery. Donor funding purchased the Panda infant warmers and resuscitation units, the Telehealth connectivity to the Stollery Children's Hospital, the ambulatory fetal monitors and the infant bassinets. Your donations also funded the creation of the Pediatrics cleanroom with isolette incubators for infants requiring bili light therapy. On average 100 babies are delivered each month at the hospital and your donations are giving mothers and infants the spaces and equipment required for their very best care.

MEDICINE, SURGERY AND ICU

Urgent care, emergency care, and surgical care are ongoing despite the pandemic. The Hospital receives patients from the region who are injured on the job, at home, in vehicle incidents, in off-road incidents, through all kinds of mishaps at home, or are suffering from heart attack, stroke or other chronic illness. Donor funding enabled the purchase of a central monitoring system which monitors patient vital signs like temperature, heart rate, oxygen, blood pressure, respiration and fluid in the heart.

The system effectively increased the Emergency Departments active beds from 4 to 25, and ICU's monitored patient beds from 6 to 8. In addition, the Health Foundation utilized donor funding to enable the purchase of portable monitors called telemetry units which are used in the ER, the surgical, medical and pediatrics wards. Your donations were also allocated to the creation of the spinal surgery unit and the expansion of orthopedic and orthoscopic surgery. Most recently, the Health Foundation Board of Directors allocated almost \$800k to the purchase of the OmniCell Drug Medication system which will soon be connected and in use throughout the hospital.

These are just a few examples of your donation dollars hard at work providing more and improved health services at the hospital. Please continue to give generously so that the healthcare you need will be available when you need it.
