In addition 30 volunteers helped ensure the event day ran smoothly and approximately 100 donors sponsored the racers. Together, you all raised \$50,000 for healthcare!

### **TELL ME MORE ABOUT THAT TREE!** An in depth look at a feature tree in the 2019 Festival of Trees Gala auction

We are looking closely at the *Operation Bear Hug Tree*, created and sponsored by Finning Canada. This tree was *beary* popular throughout the whole weekend of Festival and hundreds of people took photos of loved ones with it.

Cleverly constructed by the masterminds at Finning, the tree was fashioned on a frame of supports and graduated wire rings. The frame was then covered with 275 bright eyed white teddies, each sporting a red bow tie. Topping the tree was a big, fluffy red teddy angel and at the bottom of the tree was an even bigger fluffy red teddy complete with stethoscope!

Aside from being super cute, the tree was deeply impactful as it reminded us of the relationship between the object (the tree) and the reason for the tree. The Finning *Operation Bear Hug Tree* acknowledged that the Festival of Trees events are entirely about fundraising for healthcare and supporting community members in need of loving care, a soft touch, and a warm hug.

At the 30th Anniversary Festival of Trees Gala Live Auction this sweet tree sold for \$38,000!

Now, that could have been the end of the story, but for these bears it was just the beginning as they still needed to get to their *fur*-ever homes. And that was made possible by the purchasers of the *Operation Bear Hug Tree* – Suncor Energy.

# YOUNG PHILANTHROPISTS CELEBRATED

Youth philanthropy is on the rise in our region and we have been very grateful for the support from individuals and school groups who are fundraising and volunteering for the Health Foundation.

This past fall we had an opportunity to bring in many of the young people who donated the funds they had raised to help sick kids, elders and families. These young friends of the foundation came together with community donors to receive appreciation for their fundraising efforts and have a guided tour of the Diagnostic Imaging department.

The gathering also gave us the opportunity to unveil new equipment for the Diagnostic Imaging department - two new immobilizers to keep children safe and still during x-ray procedures - the Burton Bike and a multi-positioning chair for infants. The DI department also showed off the equipment used for a wide range of services including ultrasound, magnetic resonance



imaging (MRI), computed tomography (CT scans), and general radiography (x-ray). The kids were enthralled and asked terrific questions.

"The Burton Bike looks just like a mountain bike and I think it could be fun for a kid to be on it when they have their x-ray taken. I didn't know the hospital had this really cool equipment and could do so much for kids right here," said Joey Osmond, "I'm really happy that my brother and I did our fundraiser and I feel like we are helping other people to get better."

Mothers can move around freely and will not need to be confined to a bed to be monitored.



### Positive Immunization Experience (P.I.E.)

A Public Health initiative to help children overcome their fear and anxiety of receiving needles - especially immunizations. The educational tools and resources for nurses and comfort strategies for families can help reduce the pain of immunizations for younger clients and establish strong coping mechanisms for future health services.



### Jackson Spinal Top Surgical Table

Over \$157,000 for the Jackson Spinal Top Surgical Table which allows for optimal visualization and patient placement for all types of procedures for orthopedic fracture and trauma, pelvic reconstruction, orthopedic and neuro-spine, pain management and general procedures.
