The Northern Lights Health foundation support (and the donors!) doesn't only make a difference, it transforms the lives within the Wood Buffalo region. Every contribution helps our teams and physicians improve health outcomes, comfort to patients and families, and healing to community. I am so grateful to everyone that can support the work of our foundation.



In 2024, the beautifully renovated Suncor Heart of Health lobby at the Northern Lights Regional Health Centre was unveiled with a grand opening. Elder Lorraine Albert led a smudging ceremony, followed by a ribbon-cutting with community members, board, staff, and Suncor representatives. The transformed lobby now features a contemporary design with comfortable seating, updated flooring, and a fresh, welcoming atmosphere, enhancing both aesthetics and functionality. As part of the renovation, a new donor wall was installed, inviting visitors to stop and recognize those who contributed to the Gratitude Campaign. The space also includes improvements for greater accessibility, with clear signage and an intuitive layout to make navigating the area easier and more efficient for patients and visitors alike.



The Maternity Department was granted funding for nine (9) urgently needed baby bassinets. The HALO BassiNest Swivel Sleeper Hospital Series, which cost \$7500 each, are innovatively designed to allow healing mothers accessibility and proximity to care for their babies while reducing painful movements.

Within the initial week of use, staff reported a significant decline in mothers requests for support in caring for their newborns. This independence while still in the safe surrounding of the Maternity Department helps build confidence, especially in new mothers.

units jointly created spaces to support children and youth mental health admissions.

Mental, emotional, and behavioral disorders in childhood can cause long-term problems that may affect the health and well-being of families, and communities. Not only were incredible spaces created thanks to our generous donors, but funding also provided invaluable training in core mental health programs including psychosocial intervention to teach self-regulation and reduce sensory processing challenges.

Willow Square Continuing Care Centre

Residents have been enjoying the use of Sound Off headphones during several programs. The comfortable, noise-cancelling headphones eliminate background noise and improve sound clarity, making it easier for residents — including those who use hearing aids — to hear music, activity instructions and more. The use of this equipment has increased program accessibility and reduced residence dependency on staff assistance to clarify instructions.

Dementia Unit - Ambient Bright Lights Study

Insufficient natural lighting increases symptoms of dementia including decreased mood, cognition, and increase aggression. The foundation funded this exciting research project to investigate whether Ambient Bright Lights (ABL) can reduce these symptoms. Unlike other light therapies, ABL is applied to an area rather than directly toward an individual. This allows daily activities to continue without disruptions.

Fort McMurray receives as little as 6 hrs. and 46 mins. of sunlight during the winter season making Willow Square's Dementia Unit an ideal location to answer the question "Does Ambient Light Therapy Improve Symptoms of Dementia in persons living in Northern Communities?".

The outcome could potentially improve the quality of life for all who suffer with dementia.

Our regions Specialized Dermatology Services are provided by a long-standing collaboration between the Northern Lights Regional Health Centre and Primary Care Network. To ensure these services remain close to home. the Health Foundation provides accommodation and travel funding for our wonderful Dermatologists.


